JUNE: BUSTING OUT ALL OVER

While the "June Gloom" hovers in the skies much of the time on the West side, June is neither gloomy nor sleepy at St. Bede's. Several major events are scheduled to happen this month in the community life of the congregation.

On Sunday, June 1, at 7:00 in the evening, the Yale Alley Cats will present a musical program at the church. The Alley Cats are a group of 12 undergraduate men who sing a capella. A 60-year tradition at Yale, our own Frank Basile is a retired Alley Cat. Entrance is \$12 or an FoM Pass.

The Sisters of Bede will sponsor two Venue Events during the month. Karen Kuchel, Shannon Ferguson, Sandy Olsen & Annette Graw will host "German Wines in the Garden" on Saturday, June 7 at 4:00 p.m.

HISTORIC SERVICES TO BE PRESENTED AT ST. BEDE'S

A decade ago, Fr. Newman presented a series of services showing the development of Anglican worship over the last 450 years. Since its first use, the congregation has changed by over 75 % and some of those who remember those services have suggested that they be repeated.

Archbishop Thomas Cranmer's first prayer book was published in 1549. It was conservative in its translation and very "catholic", reflecting the majority of King Edward VI's religious advisors. Three years

later, Calvinist pressures caused the publication of a second prayer book. "It was a pendulum swing", says Fr. Newman

A year later, Edward was dead, his Roman Catholic sister Mary ("Bloody Mary") was Queen, & a number of Anglican reformers (including Cranmer) were dead. Only after Mary's death in 1559 and the accession of Elizabeth I was Anglicanism legal. This produced the third Prayer Book.

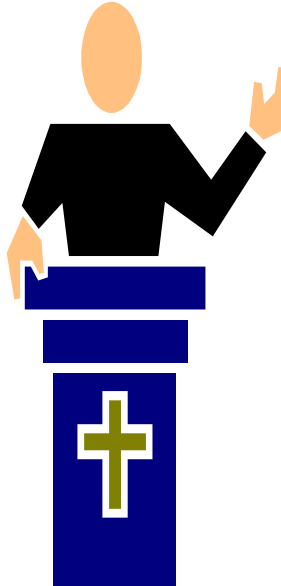

“OUR BOUNDEN DUTY...”

A rubric on page 445 of the Book of Common Prayer says: *“The minister of the congregation is directed to instruct the people, from time to time about the duty of Christian parents to make prudent provision for the well-being of their families, and of all people to make wills, while they are in health, arranging for the disposal of their temporal goods, not neglecting, if they are able, to leave bequests for religious and charitable uses”.*

We are stewards of what God has put into our hands: and our final act of stewardship is to ensure that these things are placed in good hands, to good purpose. Of course, one’s first obligation is to family, and particularly to one’s spouse and children. Prudent planning is necessary to ensure their well being, even if one lives to ripe old age. But prudence equally requires planning for their well-being in the event of our death. If some of what God has placed in our hands remains after that duty has been discharged, one must ask how it can be made to do good for other people and groups. We pres-

ently support the parish: can we make some provision that will foster its ministry and witness after our death? Likewise, we presently support various charities and other worthy organizations: can we make some provision that will support their work after our death? There are many ways to do this, including such things as annuities, life insurance policies, family trusts. But the most important instrument in ensuring that the final disposition of what God has put into your hands is not left to others or the courts is a well thought-out, carefully written will. I remember parishioners and family members who have died in testate (w/out a will), and their estates were largely eaten up by fees over years of probate. Take time to have a will drawn so that what you have received and grown will be used after your death as it was used in life, for the good of your family, your church, and of other causes you deem worthy.
